

Group discussion questions.

1. One of the first topics in this book is about forgiveness. How does DR view forgiveness, and where did that view come from?
2. How does forgiveness effect his story after the point of his forgiveness?
3. Who did his forgiveness free the most?
4. When Debbie stormed out on their relationship DR doesn't become irate, instead he still wants to continue with their relationship. Is that a form of forgiveness, or something else?
5. Mr. Jennings is still trying to kill DR, even after the spotlight of the presidency is taken away, what could drive that sort of obsession to kill someone?
6. In light of what's happening around us now, is this type of obsession unrealistic?
7. Often in movies (example- The Fugitive), and in this novel the portrayal of a cop shooter automatically gives the authorities a shoot first, ask questions later theme. Is that a fair assessment of today's law and order establishments that you've witnessed?
8. Is Jennings obsession demonic, fueled by a desire for power, or both?
9. Jennings became a member of Circle before going off the deep end, so to speak. What do you think Circle is and do you see a relevance with today's society?
10. The portrayal of Congressman Max Rice and Senator Brummengarten as felonious co-conspirators with Mr. Jennings is central to the story. Do you see examples where members of today's Congress may be behaving in a similar manner?
11. Child trafficking is central to this story. Can you see this happening in our society today?
12. One of the story line scriptures is Romans 8:28. Here God has taken the tragic instances in DR and Michelle's lives and turned them around for good, to help other children in harsh circumstances. Do you see it this way as DR and Michelle discuss opening the Tahira Childrens Home?

13. DR is willing to forgive Debbie and continue their relationship, what do you think?
14. Was Debbie challenging DR's conviction to live his *Michigan Strong*? Or was she simply overreacting to her own pressure to choose right from wrong, according to society or God?
15. Is Ryan ever going to be a good match for Willie?
16. Is Willie over her crush on DR, or is it still under the surface, ready to pounce at the right moment?
17. Why can't Mike keep a secret? Is he a gossip, or does he really think he's helping the situation?
18. The main driver of the first novel was DR's parents not going to the police, afraid people would talk. Was Stevie's reaction too harsh, should he have confronted his parents?
